Mixed methods approaches would be advantageous using quantitative data from databases plus qualitative information to derive a range of variables and indicators. When resources are limited or there is no current practice of measurement of community empowerment the simplest approach is to combine a selection of quantitative variables and indicators available in statistical databases. When resources can be allocated a more systematic approach would supplement such accessible data with some form of rapid qualitative assessment. Ideally a formal national monitoring and evaluation system would be instituted that collects all the relevant quantitative and qualitative data and combines these into a regularly updated assessment.

Jul 17 2021 Eastern spruce dwarf mistletoe (*Arceuthobium pusillum*) (ESDM) is a native dwarf mistletoe in Minnesota. It is a parasitic plant that damages black spruce (*Picea mariana*) through branch distortions known as witches' brooms, and leads to increased mortality and reduction in regeneration success. Treatments for ESDM involve removal of infested trees, which is typically done utilizing a clearcut. While ESDM has been managed for decades in black spruce stands in Minnesota, little is known about the effectiveness of the management approaches. This research is part of an interdisciplinary study to increase detection and management options for ESDM. This piece of the research was a qualitative assessment of loggers' and timber sale foresters' knowledge and perceptions of effectiveness of current ESDM management practices in black spruce. Five research questions were examined: 1) Can foresters and loggers identify ESDM? 2) Do foresters and loggers understand the need to eradicate ESDM where timber production is the objective? 3) Are the eradication treatments implemented as designed? 4) Are there impediments to implementing management treatments? and 5) Are the treatments

effective? Data were gathered through in-depth interviews and focus groups with loggers, as well as focus groups with timber sale foresters, in the study area.
