*Anna and Dr Helmy* Nov 23 2021 The remarkable story of Mohammed Helmy, the Egyptian doctor who risked his life to save Jewish Berliners from the Nazis. One of the people he saved was a Jewish girl called Anna. This book tells their story. The Israeli holocaust memorial at Yad Vashem has to date honoured more than 25,000 of the courageous non-Jewish men and women who saved Jewish people during the Second World War. Mohammed Helmy was the most remarkable individual amongst this brave group, but he was by no means the only one.
